

Spotlight On: Hemmeter Commercial Properties, Inc.

Formally incorporated on March 23, 1987, a separate entity was created to handle all commercial leasing activities of the organization. The officers named were Christopher B. Hemmeter, chairman and CEO; Diane J. Plotts, president and COO; Jack Stevenson, executive vice president; Mark M. Hemmeter, vice president; Christopher R. Hemmeter, vice president; Peggy A. Won, treasurer; and Troy Nakamura, secretary.

The Commercial Properties management team of the Hemmeter organization, however, began with the opening of King's Village (then called King's Alley). The retail area of Hemmeter Center soon was added to the portfolio, followed by the retail areas of Hyatt Regency Maui, some locations at the International Marketplace, the commercial areas of The Westin Maui, The Westin Kauai, and the soon-to-be-opened Kauai Lagoons, Phase III.

Jack Stevenson joined the firm on December 12, 1977 as general manager, Commercial Properties, and has been the driving force behind his team, ably assisted by Patrice Franks, his executive assistant. Jane Stevenson has the tremendous responsibility of principal broker, assisted by Sonia Han and Lela Blunck in the preparation of lease documents. Paul Naki of King's Guards to produce a video of the property to be used for leasing purposes.


