

Gar Wood Plans Airplane Hunting Trip to Africa

MIAMI, Feb. 22.—(AP).—Plans for an airplane flight from Alexandria, Egypt, up the Nile river into the heart of Africa, where he will go big game hunting and will make color photographs, were announced by Gar Wood today, internationally known speed-boat builder and racer.

Dr. Claude Dornier, noted German builder of metal hull flying boats, who has been in Detroit in connection with his sale of three huge flying boats to the Detroit and Cleveland Navigation Company for service between those two cities, will be Mr. Wood's guest at Miami Beach next week. He is coming to Miami to give details of his Dornier-Wall and Dornier-Super Wall planes to Mr. Wood.

Dr. Dornier has been the guest of Henry Ford at Detroit, and has been working with officials of the Ford and Stout Air Service organizations on the Detroit-Cleveland flying boat service.

Mr. Wood said that he believed it best to purchase an airplane built in Europe for the Nile flight and that he would take delivery of it in Europe or Egypt. It would be specially equipped and fitted out for the trip with moving picture and hunting equipment.

Mr. Wood said that he would be accompanied by one friend only, besides the pilot and mechanic needed to handle the airplane.
