5. Applause is welcome and considered appropriate at the following times:
  1. After awards for company honor men and best shipmates have been presented.
  2. After awards to band and honor guard members.
  3. After awards to recruit companies. (Received by guidons)
  4. Any special awards.

We hope that you share our pride in the young men participating in the Recruit Regiment Review today. On the parade field are 8 companies totaling approximately 500 men. At present, there are 1,200 recruits undergoing training at the Coast Guard Training Center.
