Hemmeter Aviation Expands its Operations to Gander, Newfoundland

On October 3O, 1988, Hemmeter Aviation opened its first FBO facility outside Hawaii in Gander, Newfoundland to provide corporate crews and their passengers with the same exceptional service and exclusive facilities they have become accustomed to at our FBOs in Hawaii.

The FBO will be in the former headquarters of Eastern Provincial Airways, a 106,000 sq. ft. hangar with more than 4.5 acres of private ramp space. The building, vacant for two years, will undergo a renovation program over the next twelve to eighteen months — the end result, 50,000 sq. ft. of office and shop space. In the interim, an exclusive VIP lounge, offices and crew areas have been constructed in Gander's main terminal.

Gander Township Offers Wide Variety of Activities

The main town of Gander is just a stone's throw from the airport. Aviation is the lifeblood of the community. Today life in Gander revolves around its International Airport, which is known as "The Crossroads of the World."

The original city was actually an old WWII base and has since been relocated to its current site. Hence, Gander is a relatively new township with a youthful population.

The city offers a myriad of shopping opportunities, a large selection of local restaurants and a full range of accommodation options. (In addition to the wonderful variety of fresh seafood you might expect to find in such a country, you can always sample the local favorite — Moosel) Nitelife includes an assortment of clubs that offer something for every taste — from a quiet lounge to live rock & roll.

The nearby shores of Gander Lake ensure a full range of recreational activities. Featured is a boat marina, which opens up the whole of the lake to the boating enthusiast. Ferries to outer points are available. Canoeing is popular, with rentals on site, in addition to small pontoonequipped aircraft for charter. A 9-hole golf course is situated on the slopes overlooking the beautiful lake

Gander River provides sport salmon fishing, which is known to be some of the best in the world. Trout fishing is favored in the many smaller lakes which dot the country-side, while cod fishing is available in the Atlantic, quite near shore.

Traditional fishing outports, icebergs and pods of whales are commonplace, as are sandy beaches and breathtaking views. Majestic fiords and windswept moors will delight the eye, as well as the numerous large and small game that abound, making opportunities to view wildlife easy.

Hiking and walking trails are numerous, including a full selection of crosscountry ski trails for experienced and novice alike. ATV and snowmobile enthusiasts will find the countryside and snow cover conducive to their sports also. Another fun and different pastime is ice skating.
