


We are pleased to announce that Byron Ho has been designated our Safety Manager.

As of this writing, there are three large fractional ownership companies: Executive Jet (also known as Net Jets and EJ), Flight Options and Flex Jets.

EXECUTIVE JET AVIATION

Many of you were involved in the audit conducted by several Executive Jet Aviation (EJA) staff in June. Thank you for your participation! You can all be proud of the results!

Effectively immediately, EJA, also known as Net Jets, has selected Bradley Pacific Aviation as their preferred handler in Hawaii!

EJA is the largest fractional aircraft ownership company in the world. All of their aircraft tail numbers end in "QS" for Quarter Shares; their fleet consists of Boeing, Gulfstream, Falcon, Cessna, and Raytheon aircraft. "In the last 3-1/2 years, EJA has ordered 600 new aircraft...almost 40% of the world's business jets." EJA currently manages 240 aircraft with 465 more aircraft on order. They are based in Columbus, Ohio.

FLIGHT OPTIONS



NAIL IN THE FENCE






Laurie Kimura from our Maui Office, wanted to share this "Philosophy of Life" with us that she received from her Mother.
