Men In Jewish Plane Export Plot Will Plead Guilty

MIAMI (Fla.), Jan. 20.—(P)—Nine men indicted in an international conspiracy to export war planes destined for Palestine will plead guilty as charged.

The authorities said the men, six of whom have never been taken into custody, have informed them through their attorneys they will

plead guilty.

Assistant United States District Attorney Fred W. Botts said he has called off the trial of two defend-

ants set for next Monday.

Botts said Charles Winters of Miami and Puerto Rico will be brought before United States Judge Alfred Barksdale here Friday for plea and Abraham Levin, North Hollywood, Calif., will plead in California.

supervising Customs Agent Chester A. Emerick said Irvin Schindler, Miami Beach pilot, is at liberty under bond in New York and will plead there. The Schindler arraignment was postponed until

January 25th.

Emerick said the other men will return to this country and plead in their respective districts. They are listed as Adolph W. Schwimmer, Bridgeport, Conn.; Leon Gardner, North Hollywood, Calif.; William Sosnow, alias Lou Gordon, New York City; Michael Kane of California; Leonard Burns, San Francisco, and Ervin L. Johnson, no address.

The men were charged with conspiracy to export illegally three B17s from Miami to Zatec, Czechoslovakia, last June 11th.

Twenty one other persons were named as coconspirators but not as defendants.
