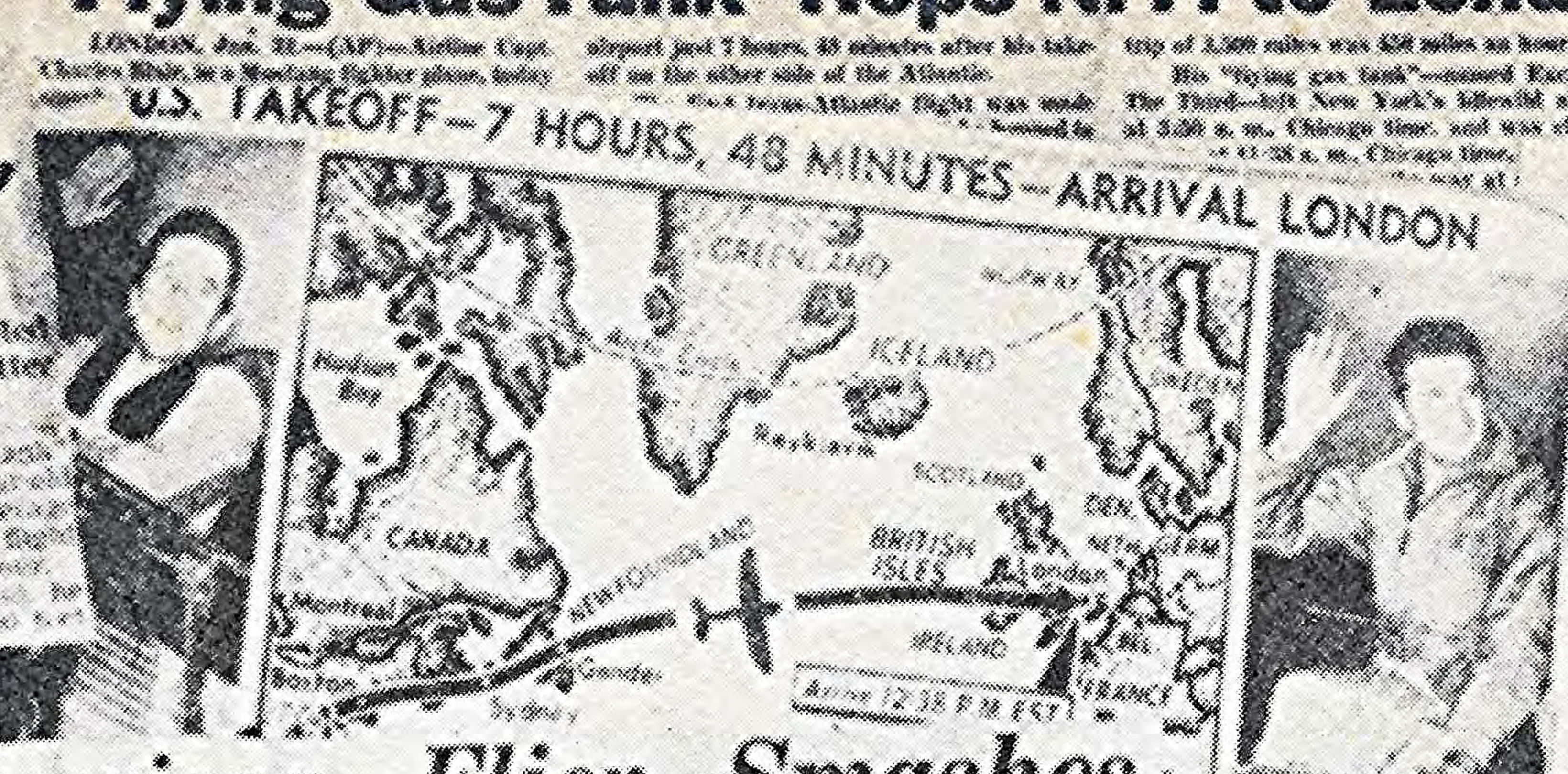


Lindbergh 1951 Lands in London, Smashes Record
